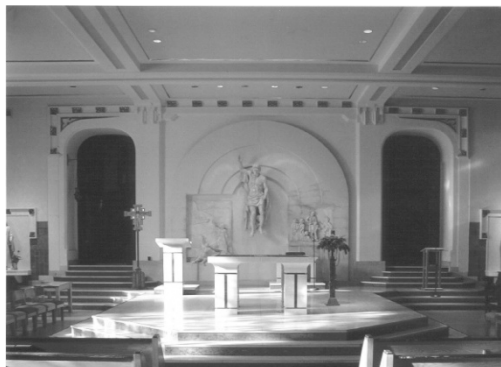

“MEMORABLE EVENTS FROM LAST WEEKEND”

Many of our parishioners may not be aware that our fourth and fifth grade students have had the opportunity for an in-depth experience, and appreciation, of both music and dance. In terms of playing a musical instrument, this is the FIFTH year that our fourth grade students had the opportunity, and advantage, of learning to play the violin. A demonstration of their progress took place on Friday, June 15, at 8:15 A.M.



On Friday, June 15th, nineteen of our eighth graders participated in the “Annual Commencement Exercises” for “Resurrection-Ascension Catholic Academy”. As always, our graduates leave us with a deep feeling of pride, and cause to rejoice. Scholarships awarded our graduates, along with honors, and the singling out of those who excelled in various subjects, are a clear sign of their preparedness for future academic challenges as they “move on” to High School, and beyond. How reassuring, then, that their future will be met with success, resulting in their looking back, with a deep sense of gratitude, for all that was done to prepare them, during their learning foundation, for the past ten [or less] years.

Among these graduates were FIVE students winning partial scholarships to the following high schools: St Vincent Ferrer, Notre Dame High School of Manhattan, McClancy Memorial High School, Christ the King, Archbishop Molloy and Holy Cross High School. In addition to receiving a partial scholarship to Holy Cross High School, this same graduate won a full scholarship to Regis High School. An additional highlight of this graduation was the return on one of our former teachers, **Mrs. Linda Mezcic**, currently an assistant principal at St Luke’s in Whitestone. As their former Science teacher, Mrs Mezcic, spoke about neurons in the brain, and the connection with the changing events one experiences. After having taught here for 21 years, Mrs. Mezcic concluded with her experience of change and its implications for her—as will be for these graduates—with the words of former President, John F. Kennedy: “Change is the law of life, and those who look only to the past, or the present, are certain to miss the future.”



On Saturday, June 16, after the 5 P.M. Mass, a Farewell took place to honor Joyce Mennona, who will be moving on to teach at Sacred Heart Academy, in Hempstead. Parishioners attended a social in Msgr Dooley Hall (gymnasium), to express their gratitude, and thanks, to Joyce for her service to this parish for the past thirteen years. We trust that her experience here will help to equip her for the challenges that may lie ahead, while assuming a teaching position.

On Sunday, June 17th, at the 9:30am Mass, special recognition was given to one of our ushers, John Haughney, who has served as Minister of Hospitality, for more than 30 years. Due to recent physical limitations, John had to ask to be relieved of his responsibility, and attend Masses as a worshipper. In recognition for his faithful service, a plaque was presented to John, which read as follows: **“Presented to John Haughney, with gratitude for your many years of service “.**

On Monday, June 18th, at 8:15 A.M., parents were able to witness how our fourth, and fifth graders, had their first exposure to such dances as the: rumba, waltz, swing, foxtrot, tango, salsa, stomp, and the meringue. This presentation was introduced by the educational liaison, and the instructor of dance. The audience was then informed that the purpose of this program was to give our students an awareness of the importance of “team work”, the value of “respect”, and a sampling of “elegance. The format was very cleverly “mapped out” up by having some of our fourth and fifth graders first report, and also, share their first impressions of what they anticipated as a new experience in learning how to: dance with a partner, change partners, and become acquainted with the various dance steps, from the above varieties of dance. Our students also gave a *history* of some of the dance forms which proved that this was also an academic learning experience. The morning’s program concluded with our “budding dancers” choosing their new partners from the audience—namely, a parent or another member of the family.

Fortunately, this has been the fifth year that such an opportunity has been offered to our fourth and fifth graders, who have benefitted from the program’s intent to promote: team work, respect, and exposure to the meaning of “elegance.” Undoubtedly, it was very impressive to watch our youngsters formally dressed— as the saying goes: “in their Sunday best”—while mastering the challenging steps of such a variety of dance forms. Thanks to our principal, Mrs. Heppt, who, obviously, has been very supportive as to the value of this experience. Who knows—in a few years, some of our fourth and fifth graders may—one day—appear as a contestant on the annual show, “Dancing with the Stars!”
